AGRI'S GOT TALENT: Fruit and wine industries' agricultural workers celebrate singing talent with musical showcase

Ten years ago, Anton Rabe, Hortgro's executive director, was on his way somewhere, when the thought suddenly hit him... there's Idols, America's Got Talent... why not Also Agri's Got Talent?

"Our agricultural workers have so much more to give than just working on farms, cellars, or packhouses. They're tremendously talented people."

Back at the office, Rabe shared the idea with then colleague, Retha Louw. "She started the project. Initially small, but within a few years AGT, as it is known today, grew into the most exciting project in Agriculture," says Rabe.



On Saturday evening 18 November, ten years of AGT were celebrated at the Taalmonument's amphitheatre in Paarl. Previous years' top-ten contestants, as well as some of the winners, came together for an agricultural music spectacle.

Nearly a thousand people attended the show that was sponsored by the Western Cape Department of Agriculture, Hortgro, the Citrus Growers' Association, the South African Table Grape Association (SATI) and SA Wine.

Frieda van den Heever, renowned local artist, has been at the helm of coaching for the past ten years; she also produced the show.

AGT is more than just a singing competition. There is also a strong focus on life skills development and over the years, the top ten contestants have reached astonishing milestones.

Ayabonga Mboho, the first winner of AGT, was initially a seasonal worker. Since winning AGT, he has been invited to sing overseas three times and today teaches music at a school in Paarl. Victor Fredericks, who was in the top ten in 2018, today has a senior position at La Plaisante, Wolseley, and has published two books.

Rapper Jason Baartman took second place in 2017. Initially he was a general worker, today he shines as a production manager on the well-known farm Laastedrif, Ceres, with as many as 50 nursery workers under him, and at harvest time he also looks after 10 picking teams. Baartman is also part of the ATKV-Crescendo project and has performed at the Wordfees.

Beyond personal milestones, AGT participants give back to their communities. Newfound self-confidence, skills and knowledge are shared with families, colleagues, and the community.

They become ambassadors for agriculture. This knock-on effect cannot be measured by money but builds much-needed relationships that promote rural stability and make agriculture a proud workplace.

Western Cape MEC for agriculture, Ivan Meyer, said that AGT is great for the morale and self-esteem of agri workers. "AGT is doing amazing work in restoring dignity and wellness in our rural communities. I cannot thank the organisers enough."

Jacomien de Klerk, who represented the Citrus Growers' Association shared: "What a zesty, juicy show it was! The citrus industry is so privileged to be part of this, to help create a (real!) stage for showing what people are really capable of when you give them the opportunity to use their talents and shine brightly."

Tien jaar gelede was Anton Rabe, Hortgro se uitvoerende direkteur, op pad erens heen, toe die gedagte hom skielik tref...daar is Idols, America's Got Talent...hoekom nie ook Agri's Got Talent nie?

AGT is meer as net 'n sangkompetisie. Daar word ook sterk gefokus op lewensvaardighede ontwikkeling.

Met die jare het top-tien-deelnemers verstommende mylpale bereik. Ayabonga Mboho, die eerste wenner van AGT, was aanvanklik 'n seisoenale werker. Sedert hy AGT gewen het, is hy al drie keer genooi om oorsee te sing en gee hy vandag musiek by 'n skool in die Paarl. Victor Fredericks, wat in 2018 in die top-tien was, het vandag 'n senior pos op La Plaisante, Wolseley, en het al twee boeke gepubliseer. Jason Baartman, 'n rymkletsers het in 2017 tweede plek behaal. Aanvanklik was hy 'n algemene werker, vandag is 'n produksiebestuurder op die bekende plaas Laastedrif, Ceres, wat soveel as 50 werkers in die kwekery en in oestyd sowat 10 plukspanne onder hom het. Baartman is ook deel van die ATKV-Crescendo projek en het al by die Woordfees opgetree.
